Campgrounds near Manheim

Pinch Pond Campground

Pinch Pond Campground (pinchpond.com), less than seven miles west of Manheim MS (near Mount Gretna), offers tent camping, an RV park, rental cabins and cottages with kitchenettes and bathrooms. Shady and sunny sites are available, and pets are permitted. The campground's RV sites offer cable, electric, water and sewer services. The security gate-controlled property includes a camp store and recreation building, a 24-hour laundry facility, modern restrooms, a swimming pool and video game room. Guests have access to both Wi-Fi hot spots and a wired Internet connection. The campground hosts family friendly special events, crafts, parties and holiday activities. Holiday weekends require a three-night minimum stay.

Starlite Camping Resort

Starlite Camping Resort (starlitecampingresort.com), juts more than 15 miles east of Manheim MS, is located in the Furnace Hills area near the town of Stevens (near PGC Middle Creek) . The campground has well-spaced sites, each with electric and water, and select sites have sewer service. A dump station is available for RV campers. Campsite requests are accepted, and holiday stays require reservations and a paid deposit. The resort offers a pool and kiddie pool, outdoor sports courts, miniature golf and an arcade. Guests have use of an air-conditioned rec hall, laundry and bathhouse facilities, and a camp store is located on-site. From July through Labor Day, the campground offers daily activities ranging from bingo to movies, games and special breakfasts. Other activities are determined by weather and attendance and include night swimming, crafts, hikes and cookouts.

Thousand Trails Resort Camping

Thousand Trails Resort Camping (zonecampingpass.com) -- at the PA Dutch County Campgrounds, less than six miles north of Manheim MS -- provides wooded campsites and full-hookup RV sites. The facilities include a camp store with a snack bar, a clubhouse and laundry area. Guests can utilize the outdoor pool and recreation areas for horseshoes, basketball and miniature golf. Families can play video games, hike the nature trail and cook out at the picnic area. Thousand Trails operates a network of campgrounds and offers an annual Zone Park Pass good for any of its campgrounds within one of four zones or a multizone pass that gives travelers access to campgrounds within all four zones.

Hershey Conewago Campground

Hershey Conewago Campground (hersheyconewago.com) is located a little more than 18 miles west of of Manheim MS. The 26-acre facility holds 160 campsites, including RV and tent sites, and seven rustic one-room cabins. The sites provide water, 30-amp electric and sewer services and hot shower access. Guests can select from among shady and pond-adjacent sites. A laundromat and country store is available on-site. For entertainment, the management provides arcade games and free Wi-Fi service. Guests can participate in outdoor movies and feed the fish in the pond. The recreation facilities include a swimming pool, an 18-hole mini golf course, a sand volleyball area, 8basketball and tennis courts. Leashed pets are allowed. The campground offers AAA discounts. and a paid deposit. The resort offers a pool and kiddie pool, outdoor sports courts, miniature golf and an arcade. Guests have use of an air-conditioned rec hall, laundry and bathhouse facilities, and a camp store is located on-site. From July through Labor Day, the campground offers daily activities ranging from bingo to movies, games and special breakfasts. Other activities are determined by weather and attendance and include night swimming, crafts, hikes and cookouts.
